entrance tickets

The tour starts on the island of **Ostrow Tumski**, the oldest part of the city. This place was the capital of the early Polish state in the 10th century. What is a must to see here? **The Archcathedral Basilica of St. Peter and St. Paul**, the oldest cathedral in Poland (as Pope John Paul II used to say: “this is where Poland started”) and the Gothic Church of the Most Holy Virgin Mary, built in the 15th century.

Nex step will be the **charming Old Town**, with its most admirable places: **the Old Town Square** and **the Renaissance Town Hall**. Here you will see the most famous clock mechanism in Poland, **the goats of Poznan** (in Polish: “Poznańskie Koziołki”) that butt their heads every day at noon.

From there you will stroll through the narrow streets of this historical area until you reach **St. Stanislav’s Church** (also known as “fara”), a precious pearl of the Polish Baroque, brimming with gilded ornaments and moldings.

To make the tour more enjoyable, you will visit **the old brewery** and the remains of a Prussian fort at the end of the day. It was modernized several years ago through a new glass and steel structure, creating today a unique shopping, artistic, and business center. Be careful and don’t spend all your money!
